UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following O R D E R  $\,$ 

On the oral request of learned counsel for the petitioner, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India is impleaded as respondent.

Dr. A.B. Akolkar, Member Secretary of the Central Pollution Control Board and Mr. K. Sundershan, Dy. Chief Controller of Explosive, Sivakasi are present in Court today. We have heard them as well as learned counsel for the parties.

It appears that no standards have been laid down by the CPCB with regard to air pollution by the bursting of fire-crackers. Dr. Akolkar says that it will take some time to arrive at the standards and it will be done by 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 at the latest.

In the meanwhile, we direct that no fire-crackers manufactured by the respondents shall contain antimony, lithium, mercury, arsenic and lead in any form whatsoever. It is the responsibility of the Petroleum and Explosive Safety Organisation (PESO) to ensure compliance particularly in Sivakasi.

There seems to be some doubt about strontium and its compound. We would like to hear submissions in this regard. For this purpose, list the matter on 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2017.

On that date, we will also consider modification of the interim orders passed by this Court.

We make it clear that for setting up of standards, collaborative efforts will be made between CPCB and PESO.

Dr. A.B. Akolkar, Member Secretary of the Central Pollution Control Board and Mr. K. Sundershan, Dy. Chief Controller of Explosive, Sivakasi should remain present on the next date of hearing.
