May 17,	It is admitted on behalf of the Nigam that there is			
2016	arsenic in the ground water of Balia area. However, there			
jg	are 183 handpumps which have already been provided			
	with arsenic removal plant and therefore the water that			
200	finally comes from these handpumps is potable. It is			
-2.0	further stated that the pipe line for potable water is			
	provided in the area, but the residents of the area are not			
	taking water connection despite the fact that they levy a very reasonable charges of Rs. 18 per month for taking independent connection. It is also stated that there are public points from the said pipelines, from where water			
	could be taken by the residents of the area who have no			
	independent connection.			
	The learned Counsel appearing for the applicant			
	however, submits that this is not correct as according to			

him the water from the handpumps contain arsenic and people are falling sick largely. It is further stated that the claims raised by the Nigam is factually incorrect.

In light of the above, we direct a team of Scientists from Central Pollution Control Board, Ministry of Environment & Forest, & CC, Uttar Pardesh Pollution Control Board and Central Ground Water Authority of India to conduct a Joint Inspection and report to the Tribunal. They will submit comprehensive and submit the complete report which will cover all matters but inter-alia the following:

- 1. The number of handpumps where arsenic removal plants have been installed and whether such plants are actually working satisfactorily or not.
- 2. The water samples from the handpumps will be collected and analysed not only for arsenic but even for other heavy metals and water pollutants.
- 3. They will check whether the water supplied through the pipelines is available to all the residents and the reason as to why residents are not taking pipeline water connection.
- 4. They will also comment on the health of the people and particularly the averments that number of people have died as a result of consuming arsenic water regularly.
- 5. They will also inspect public water connection and whether on the public posts water is available, if so its duration and the quality of water.
- 6. The applicant would be intimated and is at liberty to be present at the time of the joint inspection.
