Item Nos.	The Learned Counsel appearing for the NCT of Delhi submits that on the basis of inter-departmental meeting held on 16th May, 2016 it has been decided as follows: 1. The industry should ensure that its ETP functions properly and does not discharge effluents in excess to the prescribed parameters. 2. The industry should furnish the Bank Guarantee of Rs. 1 lac and Security Bond of Rs. 4 lac. 3. They should handle the hazardous waste in accordance with the Hazardous Waste Rules, 2000, store it properly in their premises and enter into a regular agreement with the CETP/Ramky Enviro Engineers Ltd. for transportation and disposal of hazardous waste.	
	4. The learned Counsel appearing for the industry	
	submits that it is difficult for a small industry to	
	furnish a bank guarantee, in any case at the time of submitting the application for consent to operate.

They have furnished the Security Bond in favour of DPCC.

- 5. In light of the above and after hearing the learned Counsel appearing for the parties, we direct the industry to maintain its ETP properly and ensure that it does not discharge the effluent in excess of the prescribed parameters.
- 6. It will enter into an agreement with the CETP or even directly with Ramky Enviro Engineers Ltd. for collection, storage and disposal of hazardous waste.
- 7. The industry will not throw any hazardous waste anywhere except its transportation in accordance with law.
- 8. They will furnish the bank guarantee of Rs. 1 lac within 4 weeks from today. Once these conditions are complied with application for consent to operate can be granted. That is the very stand taken by the DPCC itself. The unit would be permitted to operate in accordance with law.

In view of the above the Original Application No.74 of 2016 and Original Application No.75 of 2016 stand disposed of with no order as to cost.
